We live in Texas! There will be storms and there will be storm debris! During these severe weather events, these are the men that work tirelessly to keep our city streets clear of debris. During heavy rain storms, they keep the storm drain inlets and drainage ditches clear to keep flooding under control. During high winds, they keep damaged trees and other debris from blocking city streets and roadways. And though we don't get much, during ice storms or snow, they keep the main thoroughfares as drivable as possible by sanding and removing any broken tree limbs. Please understand, sanding is limited to our major thoroughfares!

What to do with storm debris always comes up this time of the year. Just know that during major storm events, brush and tree damage collection will take longer than normal. The City's trash/bulk trash contracted company, Republic, will pick up the debris as quickly as possible. This is true for all weather related events that cause tree or shrub damage. Here are some helpful tips:

- Put all brush near your FRONT curb.
- Do not block your water meter.
- Do not stack piles so high that they cause a line-of-sight problem.
- Do not put your brush piles under utility lines.
- If you hire a tree trimming service to do clean up work, that service should dispose of the brush for you. If they do not, you may be asked to pay a disposal or hauling fee.
- And...we ask you to please be patient!
